

Entrance Permits

- ▶ Required of all visitors (*including walk-in and bike-in*) at all times
- ▶ **Annual Entrance Permits** ~ valid for calendar year. Purchase at Natural Resources Dept., at entrance stations prior to entering the parks and open spaces, at nearby retail outlets, and online at www.larimer.org/naturalresources

Resident Vehicle:	\$ 65
Non-resident Vehicle:	\$ 85
2nd Vehicle:	\$ 40
Resident Boat:	\$ 65
Non-resident Boat:	\$ 85
Senior vehicle:	\$ 35
Paddling:	\$ 35
Disabled:	\$ 10

- ▶ **Daily Entrance Permits** ~ one for vehicle AND one for boat. Valid day of purchase until noon the next day. Purchase at Natural Resources Dept., and at entrance stations or self-serve stations prior to entering the parks.

Reservoirs:	\$ 7/vehicle
&	\$ 7/boat
Other areas:	\$ 6/vehicle

Campsites & Cabins

- ▶ April ~ September

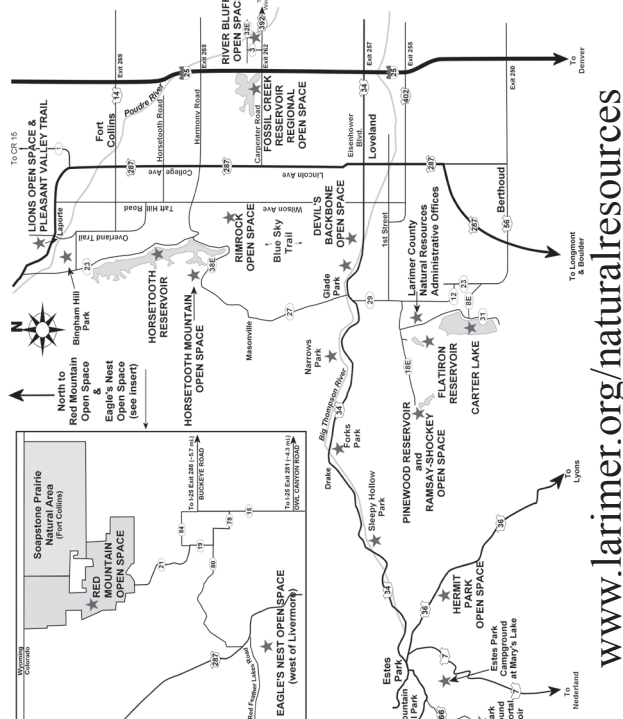
Non-electric:	\$ 15
Electric:	\$ 25
Additional camping unit:	\$ 10
Camper cabins:	\$ 60
- ▶ October ~ March

All campsites:	\$ 15
Camper cabins:	\$ 30
- ▶ Capacity varies per campsite. Maximums on largest sites are: 8 people, 1 camping unit with 1 additional at additional charge, and 2 tents, OR 8 people, no camping units, and 4 tents.

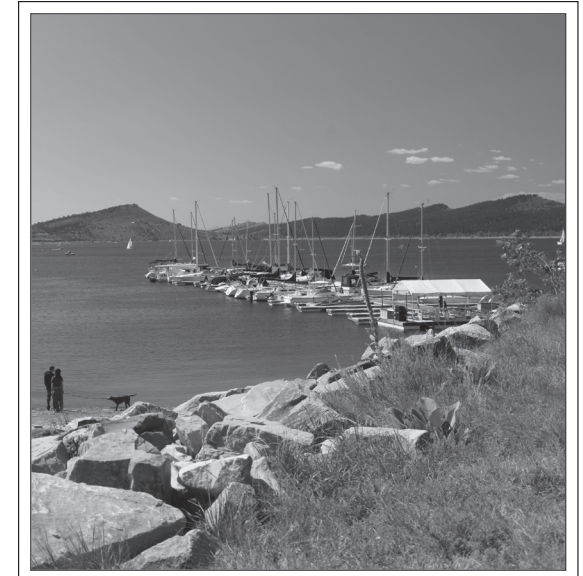


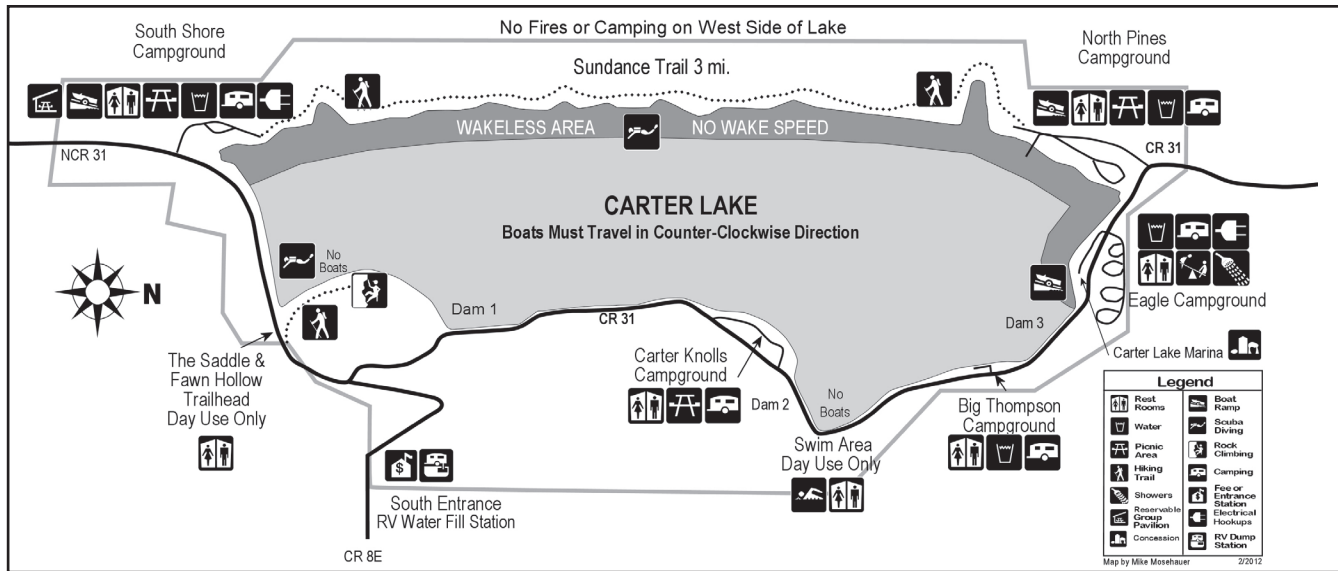

Carter Lake County Park

- ▶ In the foothills west of Loveland, Colorado
- ▶ Elevation of 5,760 feet
- ▶ 1,100 acres of water + 1,000 acres of public lands, 3 miles long, 180 feet deep
- ▶ Open year round
- ▶ Fishing (walleye, trout, kokanee salmon, largemouth bass), sailing, camping, picnicking, swimming, water skiing, hiking, diving, climbing
- ▶ Full service marina (970) 667-1062
- ▶ Boating access hours and required ANS inspections: www.larimer.org/naturalresources/boating_inspections.htm

Flatiron Reservoir County Park

- ▶ Elevation of 5,470 feet
- ▶ 47 acres of water + 200 acres of public lands
- ▶ Open year round
- ▶ Fishing (trout), camping, cabins, picnicking
- ▶ Wheelchair-accessible fishing pier

Pinewood Reservoir County Park & Ramsay-Shockey Open Space

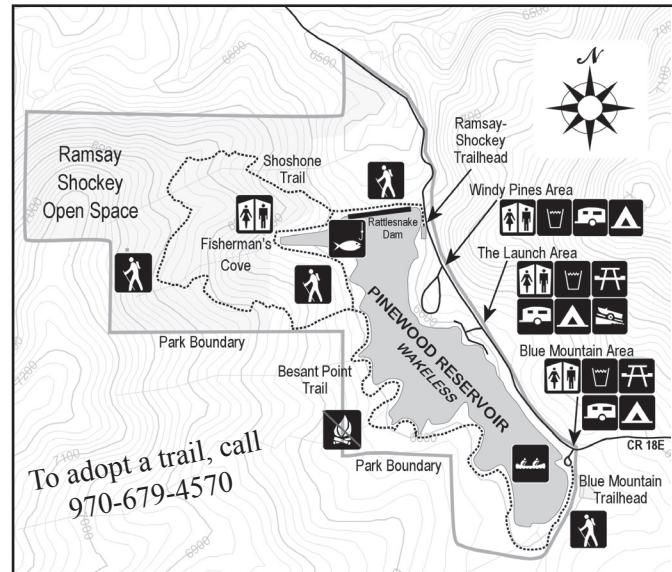
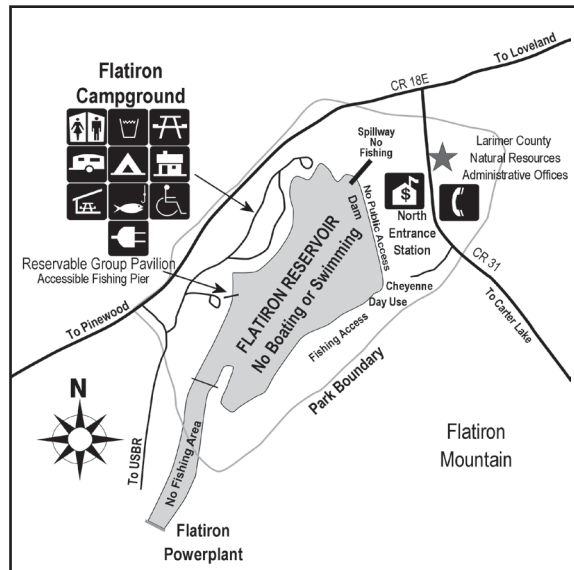
- ▶ Elevation of 6,580 feet, 80 feet deep
- ▶ 100 acres of water + 504 acres of public lands
- ▶ Open year round for wakeless boating, fishing (trout, tiger muskie), camping, hiking, biking
